Chefs hope to taste success

After a 'gruelling two months of experimental cooking', RSL team is ready to take on the state's best

GILBERT Aquino and his team are heading to the finals of the Chef's Table competition after returning to the cook-off for the first time in three years.

The Canterbury Hurlstone Park RSL Club head chef and chef de partie Sangjoon Wang will battle it out against 19 other clubs from across the state, including last year's winner, Revesby Workers' Club, represented by executive chef Hung Le and commis chef Michael Hardie.

And this year the competition has gotten harder with not one but five core ingredients.

Chefs were asked to develop a menu incorporating single origin chocolate, rabbit, fresh seafood, a native Australian ingredient and Anchor cooking cream.

The three-course menus must also be costed to meet a budget of \$22 a head.

Finalists will be judged on presentation, taste, preparation, innovation and creativity.

Aquino, 30, said teams were notified about the ingredients in November, but it took much effort and time to develop the final menu.

"It was a gruelling two months of experimental cooking," he said.

Aquino and Sangjoon will produce an entree of rabbit loin ballotine, confit leg frit-

ter and carrot three ways, followed by macadamia crusted blue eye trevalla and warm niçoise for the main meal.

For dessert, they will produce Cuba chocolate cremoux and Ghana chocolate mousse, peanut rocher and salted caramel ice cream.
